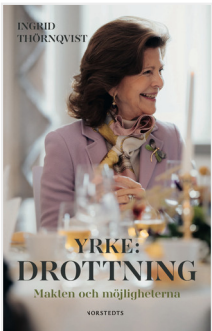

**Queen Silvia of Sweden - Few know about the important work that she is doing in addition to her royal duties. This book provides a unique insight into a very unusual mission, linked to marriage, tradition and duty - but where there are great opportunities to influence.**

Queen Silvia of Sweden has been in the public eye at King of Sweden Carl XVI Gustaf's side since 1976. We have seen her in silk dresses and glittering tiaras at Nobel Prize dinners and state visits. But few know what she has done in addition to her royal duties.

To find out how the Queen uses her role to influence important social issues, journalist Ingrid Thörnqvist has followed the Queen's everyday work for a year. How does she pursue her heart issues about sexual abuse of children, about dementia care, about the importance of adult role models for young people? What has she achieved - and how will she be described in the history books?

In this personal reportage book and with interviews with key people, the reader gets to follow the Queen's work closely - all the way into the closed boardrooms, where no journalist has previously been allowed access.

**In 2026 she will celebrate her 50th anniversary as Queen of Sweden.**

Ingrid Thörnqvist is a Swedish journalist and author. For many years, she has worked with foreign affairs for the SVT's (The Swedish broad cast company) news programs Rapport and Aktuellt. As a foreign correspondent in Germany and Eastern Europe, she reported on the fall of the Berlin Wall. She also covered the war in the Balkans, and was head of SVT's News programs foreign editorial staff. She has previously published the biography Carl-Gustaf Svingel and Silvia Sommerlath's (The queen of Sweden) Family in the Berlin of the Cold War (2020).
